ATTENDANCE

For your daughter to achieve success, she needs to be in school and in class learning. Our attendance system is designed to monitor students' absences from class.

- If your daughter is going to be absent for any reason, please telephone the Preparatory School Office on (03) 548 2194 or email prep@ncg.school.nz to notify us. Please do not use the Schoolbridge App as this is for College absences only.
- Please do not email the class kaiarahi or pass messages through classmates, as **ALL** absences must go through the computerised system which is maintained at the Prep office.
- If we cannot account for your daughter by 9:30 am we will contact you to ascertain her whereabouts.

PLANNED OR INTENDED ABSENCE

Research has shown that regular attendance at school is an important aspect of student success. The Ministry of Education has a goal of 90% attendance for all students. To support this aim, the attendance guidelines for leave approvals limit the school to the following justifications for absence.

A Justified absence, and therefore one that can be approved is defined as:-

- Unplanned absences such as a bus breakdown, accident, extreme weather event etc
- Planned non-attendance such as national/local representation in a sporting/cultural event in New Zealand or overseas.
- Approved absence (including overseas) can also include bereavement, visiting an ill relative, exceptional family circumstances.
- You will be informed at the end of each term of the percentage of your daughter's attendance.

Planned leave from school must be advised in advance and directly to Prep office either by email or letter and must have a full explanation. Please do not write to your kaiarahi. You must write separately to the Prep School, even if you have an older daughter at the College.

AFTER SCHOOL SAFETY

Students staying after 3:30 pm in the Preparatory School area for any reason need to have this arranged between the kaiarahi and parents/whānau. Sports trainings and team sports involvement will often need alternative transport arrangements.

APPOINTMENTS

If your daughter has a medical or similar appointment during school time, please either phone or email the Prep office, or send a note with your daughter. Students are not permitted to walk to external appointments alone without the permission of their parents/whānau. If you wish your daughter to do so, please put your permission in writing to the Prep office.

LATENESS

As a school, the Preparatory school, endeavours to teach students the importance of getting to school and class **on time**. If students are late, they must to report to the Prep office before heading to class.

ILLNESS

If your daughter becomes ill during the day, she needs to request permission to go home from her kaiarahi. She can then go to the Prep office and her parents/whānau will be contacted. Minor injuries/ailments are dealt with at the Prep Office. Anything requiring more than a sticking plaster or panadol will be dealt with at the NCG Student Office Sick Bay. Serious concerns are reported immediately to parents/whānau using the contact information provided by parents/whānau on the enrolment medical forms. The girls are not permitted to contact you directly. Please ensure that you keep us up to date with any changes to your contact information.

PAYMENTS TO SCHOOL

Where possible most payments will be placed directly on your daughter's account, however when it is necessary for cash to be brought to school, it should be in an envelope with the student's name, ārahi and details of the payment on the outside. The envelope can be handed in at the Prep Office. All queries relating to fees and finances are dealt with at the Main College Finance Office – danie.hall@ncg.school.nz – 03 548 3104.

CANTEEN LUNCHES

Our students are able to make full use of this facility. Food can be bought directly from the canteen at morning tea and lunchtime. Please encourage your daughter to make balanced healthy choices if she is buying her lunch from school. We encourage adequate intake of fluids during the day – water bottles should be named.

COMMUNICATION

The Prep newsletters are published at varying times during each term. It will be emailed to you and will also be available on the school website – www.ncg.school.nz. College newsletters are emailed home twice a term. This can also be accessed from the NCG website.

We provide information on the activities and achievements of our students. We will give forward notice of dates for occasions such as learning conferences or sporting and cultural events via the newsletters and the calendar. The term calendar is always available to view on the website but can but updated at any time.

Our goal is to help prepare our students for "life after school", so all students are provided with access to industry standard software.


All students are provided with an account which will allow them to download the full suite of MS Office product onto five computers (including home computers). Other subject specific software is available to those students that require it.

MUSICAL AND CULTURAL OPPORTUNITIES

A great number of musical and cultural activities are on offer to all students. The itinerant music programme allows students to have lessons on a range of different instruments during the school day, and thus alleviates the need for extra lessons at the weekend. All of our itinerant kaiako are experienced professionals and are accustomed to teaching beginners as well as more advanced players. This is a perfect time to start learning one of the more complex instruments: stringed instruments, brass, piano and woodwind all take a number of years to master, so it is always better to learn these instruments while young.

Itinerant music lessons are all offered on a private basis, so if you sign up for these you will receive a bill from the kaiako directly. School does not process itinerant music payments. Lessons are in the region of \$35 per half hour, though some kaiako offer group rates that are cheaper. You can learn the following:

All students are members of the Preparatory school choir.

The School Orchestra is a senior group and students who are Grade 4 or above on a string instrument are welcome to join. There is also a Junior Orchestra for students who are Grade 3 and above. There are also other music groups, such as flute and saxophone groups. The Prep rock band enters the BandQuest competition each year.

There will be a Music Fair in the Main College Hall from 5:00–6:00 pm on Friday 2 February 2024, where parents/whānau and students can meet the kaiako and sign up for lessons.

Year 7 students can also receive short 'Taster' music lessons during term time. This is a great way to try an instrument for two terms. They cost approximately \$12 per lesson.

INTRODUCTION TO DRAMA

The Preparatory school offers after school drama lessons on Mondays.

Drama activities and performing arts are a feature every year at Nelson College for Girls. There are opportunities for Prep students to get involved in a variety of events on stage or behind the scenes.

UNIFORM

Uniform is compulsory at our school. Students are expected to wear it correctly and with pride at all times. Health and Safety overrides the ability for students to wear certain items in class. In classes such as PE, Technology, Food, Art and in practical Science lessons, students will need to remove items at the request of the kaiako. The kaiako/school will not take responsibility for the security of any items that are removed by the student.

UPPER GARMENTS

- School navy jersey with crest or school vest with crest.
- NCG short-sleeved blouse with crest OR NCG long sleeved blouse with crest.

LOWER GARMENTS

- EITHER NCG skirt.
- OR NCG kilt.
- OR NCG trousers with crest.
- OR NCG shorts with crest.

FOOTWEAR

- Flat navy blue, black or brown sandals worn without socks (no jandals, no adornments).
- Flat completely black shoes (no ankle boots or high tops; no adornments, stripes, logos or white soles)
- Plain black or white ankle socks OR full-length tights.

OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Plain navy blue, plain black or NCG scarf.
- Plain black or navy blue jacket.
- No hoodies are permitted, including school sports hoodies.

HAIR AND MAKE UP

- Worn in a neat style if longer than shoulder length, must be tied up away from face.
- Plain and unobstrusive ribbons or hair ties.
- Hair must be a natural colour.
- No make-up and no coloured nail polish. No acrylics.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM

- Navy shorts (student's choice of style).
- Navy track pants / sports leggings in colder weather (optional) .
- Prep sports top.
- Sports shoes with non-marking soles and plain white sports socks For hygiene reasons, sports shoes for PE need to be different to the ones worn for everyday purposes at school.

SWIMWEAR

- All students using the school pool are required to wear either:
 - Swimming togs
 - Swimming tops and short board shorts

ACCEPTABLE NON-UNIFORM ITEMS

- Earrings plain, small stud or sleepers.
- Other jewellery one taonga or small necklace, one bracelet, one anklet, one ring.
- Tiny metal/plastic nose stud (ball no larger than 2 mm).

GENERAL

- Most uniform items are available from the School Uniform Shop.
- All property, including school uniform, shoes, sandals, sportswear, bag etc, must be **clearly marked** with the student's initials and surname. This should be done in indelible ink or with a firmly stitched name-tape.
- The school accepts no responsibility for lost property which can be claimed at the Student Office.


