It has been a busy month for the Poari/Board. We are thrilled to have Claire O'Fee in the new Tumuaki/Principal position. 

Pastoral News - Attendance

Many of you will be aware of the Ministry of Education's nationwide emphasis on school attendance post-Covid and the goal of regular school attendance of 90% for students. There is a direct correlation between regular attendance and academic achievement. We also know students have better social outcomes when they attend regularly. This graphic demonstrates that even just a few days missed in a year can have a big impact on attendance:



We understand that sometimes absences cannot be avoided, a special family event, medical reasons or sporting or cultural events. If your child is going to be absent, please make sure you have let Student Office know. If your child has an appointment, please specify if this is a medical or dentist appointment as this is coded differently to other appointments. Student Office also need to know the times of the appointment as well.


If you are struggling to get your child to school, please let us know as communication between home and school is vital. Your child's kaiārahi (mentor teacher) is your first contact, they have regular contact with your child and work hard to establish relationships. Together we can come up with strategies, incentives and support to increase attendance.

Facial Piercings



Pastoral News - Junior Dance

Nelson City Council and Tasman District Council are currently seeking input from the wider community on speeds around our district. An area they are particularly interested to hear from people about is speeds around schools. They would also like to get feedback from school parents.

A kind reminder to whanau to avoid parking in the bus stops outside the college. The Nelson City Council has "zero tolerance" to illegal parking around schools at opening and closing times. They have recently issued infringement notices to several drivers.



Our advice is to park legally further away from the college and have students walk a short distance to school. Bronte Street can also be used as a drop off zone although this can also be congested at key times.

Senior students bringing their own vehicles to school need to complete a permission form at the student office. This is important in case any vehicles are damaged during the school day. Students should be parking in the streets surrounding NCG, and avoid the staff carparks on Bronte Street.

Library News


The Library has been busy with Orientations for all the new Year 7's, 9's and International students. It's been lovely to see all the new faces and to issue lots of great books.
