eBus Update from the Nelson City Council

We understand that some students are finding it difficult to catch an eBus in the morning and that this is making them late to school. Here is some further information from the Nelson City Council that clarifies some of the issues. Please email the NCC with any comments regarding this information.

The eBus already operates a peak commute overflow bus, Route 7, which travels from Queen St, Richmond to Nelson City Centre each school day. The bus is scheduled to run in tandem with the Route 1 service that serves the same route but starts at Berryfields Drive, Richmond.

From time to time, if the R1 bus is running late, there will be a gap between them. In particular, when congestion in Richmond is heavy, the R1 bus can be delayed between Berryfields and the Richmond Interchange which puts a gap between the 2 buses. Sometimes that gap is a little longer than ideal and, if the first bus has been full, customers have had to wait longer than expected for that second bus to arrive or have in fact not waited as they didn't realise it was still coming.

Please be assured that we are currently working through a revision to the timetables to improve reliability on Route 1 as the running times need to be adjusted to suit the real time conditions we've encountered since the new services launched.

Please note that not all buses operating on Waimea Road to Nelson are stopping services. Route 5 from Motueka and Route 6 from Wakefield only stop at the Hospital and will not stop to collect students at other stops.

We are working to provide more reliable services across the network and we do regret any issues for students travelling on the network at peak commute. Please note that there is an earlier Route 1 bus that some students might like to target if they are worried about lateness. Students with phones can also track buses in real time on the eBus website which may help them manage the timing of their trip before they leave home.

The new e-bus service has been a great addition to the network of public transport in Nelson and Tasman and it is very popular amongst school students. We would like to remind our students travelling on the public e-buses that while they are in NCG uniform, they are representing the school.

We expect that students are following our school values, especially respect and integrity. This means using appropriate language and behaving in a way that is respectful of the other users on the bus. Nelson City Council has a document called Conditions of Carriage which also outlines expected behaviour on their e-buses for all users.

It would be appreciated if parents/caregivers could have a discussion with their child about positive bus behaviour and to let us know if they see anything that is not following our school values.

Host families will be paid a remuneration for this role and receive ongoing support from the International Department throughout the duration of your student's stay.

Students need to be in a safe and caring environment, so they feel at home and part of the family. This will help them integrate into everyday home life which is extremely important to their wellbeing.

Police vetting will be carried out for all family members over the age of 18 living in the home and we will do a home visit and meet with you before placing any students.




LIBRARY NEWS

Fakalofa lahi atu.

Talanoa Ako is a MoE initiative. Addressing digital inequity and literacy for our Pasifika community. It's a 10 week program with families receiving a new chromebook on completion.

I've delivered a few of these courses and it's awesome. Many of our fanau are excluded from engaging in their children's education.

Course incorporates Malama after school program. Children are picked up from school and taken to Nelson College by Nelson Tasman Pasifika Staff. We have registered Teachers delivering extension classes as well as games and culture.

Afternoon tea is supplied also.

Parents then arrive from work. We go into separate Talanoa Ako class in the computer suite. Dinner is then served for all. Course finishes around 8 pm and families are able to go home without having to worry about dinner.

Course works on safe spaces and faces. Delivery is from Pasifika and we also have language support those that need it.

I can not stress how important it is that the Pasifika community is armed with the knowledge (Training) and tools (Chromebook) to participate. There are some significant barriers and this initiative helps address these inequities. I would really appreciate if this info was passed on to your Pasifika fanau. Apologies for the short notice but we will hopefully run another Talanoa Ako class 2024 so please pass on all expressions of interest.

Nelson Tasman Pasifika Community Trust Education Report

Talanoa Ako is:

- An education program specifically for Pasifika parents, children, fanau and communities funded by M.O.E
- 10 targeted flexible workshops for parents, families, communities, and their children
- A program which grows parents' ability to champion their children's educational journeys.
- Delivery team includes fully registered teachers in ECE, primary and secondary education, community champions and academic mentors
- Report back through *Talanoa/survey* with one chosen set of parents and their children

Starts 22 August 2022 Monday 5.30 to 8.30pm. Each fanau receives a Chromebook after completing all sessions.

NMIT IT Level 2 Computing Course

The Level 2 Computing Course helps students to understand, use, and get to grips with mastering digital tools and technology essential in today's business world. Students learn

how to use spreadsheets, apps, tools, database and, how to apply mobile technology effectively and navigate websites.

This course is the 2nd course to be offered. The first intake completed their course at the beginning of this year, but graduation was delayed until Saturday 23rd July with 15 students graduating with certificates and laptops.

The next 30-week course will begin on Monday 5 September 2022 at NMIT. Students receive a laptop if they successfully complete the course.

An enrolment date has been set for 22 August 11am to 1.30pm in Block D at NMIT and 6pm to 8pm.

Student Support (Malama Afterschool Program)

The Student Support programme focuses on building the capability of students to learn new skills and strategies for literacy and math. Students are encouraged to:

- Discuss ideas
- Ask questions
- Practice oral skills
- Use a range of strategies for problem solving
- Complete homework with the support of trained teachers
