


Helping to support Literacy

This year we have been working on a school-wide approach for some basic literacy strategies to help strengthen transferable literacy skills for our ākonga. The strategies are being used by all Learning Areas for our junior classes. There are five strategies: Punctuation, Reading, Sentences, Paragraphs and the Writing Process. We thought it would be a good idea to share these with whānau so you can support your tamariki in the use of these strategies. Included in this newsletter are the first two - Punctuation and Reading.

#1 - Punctation Pyramid


It would be great if you could have a discussion with your child around their knowledge of the different punctuation symbols and the appropriate use of them. If they are unsure, they could search up on the internet or ask one of their kaiako.



#2 - Read to Unwrap & Understand Text

The reading strategy is designed to develop the skill of reading to understand. It would be excellent if you could help your child practice this skill at home. You could both read an article and then both work through the strategy - this will generate discussion and aid in a deeper understanding, both of the article content and the use of the strategy.

In the next newsletter we will share with you the remaining three strategies, however, if you would like to know before then, just ask your child to take a photo of the strategies - they are displayed in every classroom.





NCG sent seven teams across the country for NZSS tournament week in late August/early September, with some amazing results:

Underwater Hockey:

Netball:

Our Senior A team travelled to Invercargill for the SISS Senior Netball Champs and finished 12th overall, another great result and barely missing the top ten with an overtime loss to Cashmere.

Dame Sophie Pascoe

Dame Sophie had a message for everyone, young and old alike, giving a very inspirational talk to Yr10 students in the NCG Library, covering:

🏊 the importance of having a positive and supportive team around you on your journey through life

📤 the challenges of being a disabled person and how she overcame them

🣤 being Sophie the person, not just Sophie Pascoe the Olympic swimmer

not putting all your eggs in one basket, in case it doesn't work out recognising that everyone's goals and journeys are different knowing that it's OK not to be OK and to ask for help

🣤 being proud of who you are

A slew of questions followed, including:

? What are your plans for the future? She said she lives year by year ? Did you ever have doubts on your journey? She admitted that it was hard watching her friends going out having fun when she had to spend so much time training.

NZ national treasure, Dame Sophie Pascoe, is an eleven-time Paralympic gold medallist and multiple World Champion in Para swimming. At the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games, Sophie won four medals – taking her total tally to 19 Paralympic medals. This has now made Sophie the most decorated and successful New Zealand Paralympian ever!


NCG Family Reunion




Students driving to school

Ārahi - our pastoral groups at NCG.


Kaiārahi - the teacher leading an Ārahi group.
